December 5, 2022 REGULAR MEETING MINUTES

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Town of Haxtun have adopted a budget in accordance with Local Government Budget Law, on December 5th, 2022.

WHEREAS, the amount of money necessary to balance the budget for general operating expenses is \$189,520 and;

SECTION I: That the purpose of meeting all general operating expenses of the Town of Haxtun during the 2023 Budget Year, there is hereby levied a tax of 22.630 mills upon each dollar of the total valuation for assessment of all taxable property within the Town for the year 2023.

SECTION II: That the Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to immediately certify to the County Commissioners of Phillips County, Colorado, the mill levies for the Town of Haxtun as herein above determined and set.
